










Containment (Prevention)
(Focus on communities) vs

Mitigation (Response)
(Focus on Health Systems)


- Personal responsibility to protect self and others
- Public health and social measures (previously non-pharmaceutical interventions)
- Self-isolation when mildly symptomatic
- Seeking healthcare when symptoms get worse

- State responsibility to protect the health system from excessive strain
- Protecting the health workforce and services
- Management of severe disease in hospitals and clinics
- Active surveillance and management of cluster outbreaks

Willingness to get vaccinated when eligible to do so by province

Residents in Limpopo and North-West are the most willing to get vaccinated, with more than 70% willingness (6-10).

Neutrality dominates in the Northern Cape, while the Western Cape shows the highest unwillingness (47%).



Those in the North- West are significantly more likely to show willingness (6-8) towards the vaccine










Doctors and nurses are the most trusted with regards to vaccine advice








INFORMATION SOURCES USED FOR COVID-19







PSYCHOLOGICAL DISTRESS

BY PROFESSIONAL CATEGORY AND EMPLOYMENT SECTOR

- Overall approximately 20% of all participants were severely distressed, whilst just over half the sample had low distress.
- Psychological distress was significantly higher among nurses than medical practitioners and other health care professionals (p<0.001), and among public sector employees than those in the private or other sectors (p=0.012).











What about to reform?

Adoption funnel of new beliefs and behaviours













Tranformational Model of Communication in a Pandemic



- being valued and trusted by all people,




